From the Philippines to Uganda

Roland S. Impresso Jr.'s Journey of Faith and Education

We are pleased to share the inspiring journey of Roland S. Impresso Jr., who recently achieved a significant milestone by earning a Master in Divinity degree from our university in 2023. Originally from the Philippines, Roland's story takes an unexpected turn as he now dedicates his time to missionary work in Uganda, alongside his wife, who recently welcomed their first child.



Roland first learned about NationsUniversity in 2016, but due to prior commitments, he couldn't enroll at that time. Juggling responsibilities as a minister and completing a BS degree in Legal Management, it wasn't until 2019 that he applied for a missionary visa to Taiwan. Unfortunately, an accredited theology degree was a prerequisite, leading him to pursue studies with us. His coursework proved instrumental in navigating the challenges posed by the pandemic. When international borders reopened in 2022, Roland was well-prepared, holding a Graduate Certificate in Biblical Studies. This qualification enabled him and his wife to embark on their mission in East Africa, beginning in Kenya. Roland spent six months teaching at a local Bible school before being relocated to Uganda, where he currently leads in organizing and instructing theology and Bible courses for church leaders.

Reflecting on his experience, Roland expresses his gratitude for discovering NationsUniversity. He states he found an affordable, accessible, and accredited theological institution that not only enriched his personal life but also fortified his ministry. He is particularly grateful for the generous donors dedicated to supporting students from developing nations. The critical and scholarly approach to Scripture that NU employs has empowered Roland to develop both spiritual depth and a comprehensive understanding of Christianity. Each course has direct relevance to his life and ministry, significantly enhancing his teaching at Bible schools and sharing the gospel.

Dogo Njela: A Remarkable Contributor to NationsUniversity's Community

In the NationsUniversity Group page on Facebook, one student has stood out as a prolific contributor under the pseudonym Enoch Ben Adonai. With each post, this student shares verses from Scripture, thoughtfully paired with fitting imagery. This approach, inspired by 1 Corinthians 2:4, serves as a powerful reminder that true spiritual impact lies not in eloquent words of human wisdom, but in the demonstration of the Spirit's power.

Behind the pseudonym is Dogo Njela, a 33-year-old residing in Yaounde, Cameroon. Commencing his studies in 2017, Dogo completed his Certificate in Biblical Studies in December 2019. Rather than pursuing further academic endeavors, he chose to channel his knowledge towards serving the Lord. This decision led him to become a dedicated leader steward at Walking with Yahweh Ministry and establish the Enoch School of Ministry.

"The LORD is my rock and my fortress and my deliverer; My God, my strength, in whom I will trust; My shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold" (Psalm 18:2).

Dogo attributes his calling to serve Yahweh to a period of feeling lost and without direction. It was then that the Lord guided him to NationsUniversity. The courses proved transformative, enabling him to better understand God's Word, discern His plan, and solidify his mission as a minister (2 Timothy 2:15).

Expressing deep gratitude, Dogo acknowledges the invaluable support from NationsU's staff, qualified instructors, donors, and partners. Method Moyo Ministers in Zimbabwe

NATIONSU IN ZIMBABWE

In October 2021, a very encouraging photograph appeared on Facebook. It was posted by one of NationsUniversity's students who shared that he had passed the final degree offered by NU, a Master of Divinity. I thought it would be fascinating for us to catch up with Method Moyo and for him to recount how his faith in the Lord and his degrees have helped him.

Method is 32 years old and is a born-again Christian living in Zimbabwe. He is married and has been blessed with two children. From the age of eight, he had a zeal to study the word of God, but due to his poor background, he could not afford to attend a Bible school or seminary. His prayers were answered in 2016 when he discovered NationsUniversity and was surprised that he could receive a free education in theology and ministry. He is a true testament to how dedication and commitment pay off as, within six years, he had finished the fourth degree at the university. Method expressed gratitude to the sponsors and donors of NU and to NU itself for making this possible.

Since graduating, Method has been involved in various ministries. The first is in the church, where he serves as a Pulpit Minister with the Church of Christ. Secondly, he has also worked as a Country Director with Open Christian Ministries, an organization involved in missions and marketplace ministry. The third role is one that caught my attention. At the start of this year, he took on the role of Ward Pastor at Cure Children's Hospital of Zimbabwe, run by a Christian organization called Cure International. The hospital treats children with disabilities. His primary duty is to provide pastoral care to both the children and their caregivers. Method states that his goal is that no one who enters the hospital leaves without hearing the good news of the Gospel. The fourth and final role he mentioned is related to his position at Cure International. He has become involved in facilitating Theology of Disability Training Seminars, which equip Christian leaders and ministers in Zimbabwe to understand disability. Recently, he was invited by Bear Valley Bible Institute Zimbabwe to teach a Theology of Disability course to their students.

In a country with high unemployment and where many already hold degrees, Method has used his degree from NationsUniversity to open doors. This is a testimony to the quality of NU's courses. Opportunities were opened to Method for him to work with big Christian organizations he never dreamed of. "NU taught me that I am mandated to go out there and change my world. The school emphasized on the Great Commission that we should go out and make

a difference by seeking the lost. I am confident that NU is training Christian leaders around the world who are making a big impact. I am happy that Zimbabwe is benefitting from the generous work that NU is doing. If more leaders are trained in Zimbabwe, more impact will be felt."

Finally, Method thanked the donors as their funding helps NU provide education to disadvantaged communities. To those new students who benefit from this, he encourages them to stay focused and never to lose hope.


